



In addition to what is accepted at the Eldorado Convenience Center, the following items can be dropped off at La Tienda for reuse and recycling. Take items to the Building A hallway unless noted otherwise:

Item	What happens to it?
Clean #5 plastics	All containers should be empty and clean. Taken to Whole Foods, then shipped to Preserve for manufacture into new products.
Wine bottle corks	Used by local artist.
Toothbrushes Toothpaste tubes & caps Dental floss containers Deodorant containers & caps (non-aerosol only)	All containers should be empty and clean. Shipped to TerraCycle for manufacture into new products through the Tom's of Maine recycling program. Payment donated to a local school.
Hair care packaging Skin care packaging Cosmetics packaging (non-aerosol only)	All containers should be empty and clean. Shipped to TerraCycle for manufacture into new products through the Garnier recycling program. Payment donated to a local school.
Pens, markers, mechanical pencils	Shipped to TerraCycle where plastic and metal parts are recycled. Thanks to CH2M-OMI for its support.
Rubber bands	Reused by local newspaper carriers.
Athletic shoes (Collection bin near Eldorado Fitness Studio entrance - Bldg B)	Good quality shoes are donated to a local charity for reuse. Others are recycled through Goodwill's programs.
Christmas lights (seasonal only – Bldg B)	Taken to Capital Metals. Payment supports our E/285 Recycles programs.
Printer ink cartridges ❖ Drop off in box in Building A	Eldorado Computer Works recycles and donates proceeds to the El Dorado Community School.
Computers and related electronics ❖ Drop off with Eldorado Computer Works in Building A	Workable computers are donated for reuse. Nonworking components are recycled using environmentally certified recyclers.
